

ITEMS FOR A DISASTER SUPPLY KIT

A WELL-STOCKED & WELL PLANNED SUPPLY KIT CAN SAVE UNTOLD HARDSHIPS IN AN EMERGENCY SITUATION.

- **Cash** - Banks and ATMS may not be open or available for extended periods.
- **Water** - At least one gallon daily per person for up to 7 days.
- **Food** - Enough for each person for up to 7 days
Non perishable packaged or canned foods
Food for infants or elderly
Snack foods
Non-electric can opener
Paper plates & plastic utensils
- **Radio** - Battery operated w/spare batteries
- **First aid kit** - Including antibacterial cleaning agents
- **Medication** - Prescription Drugs & NON-Prescription Drugs in ample supply
- **Flashlight** - With spare batteries
- **Toiletries** - Hygiene items -moisture wipes
- **Bedding** - Blankets and Pillows
- **Clothing** - Also include rain gear
- **Vehicle** - With a full tank of gas
- **Pet care items** - Food, water, carrier or cage, muzzle & leash if needed
- **Cleaning supplies** - Non -scented liquid bleach
- **Mosquito repellent & sun screen**
- **Ice chest/cooler** - With ample supply of ice
- **Masking or duct tape**
- **Trash bags.**
- **Fire extinguisher** - keep with you in safe room.
- **Books & Games** - for kids
